While visiting with the congregation in Bohicon (Benin, West Africa), I had the privilege to preach the word and then answer questions...a lot of questions! A question that was put to me by one young man really drove home the point that Bohicon is at the epicenter of idolatry and witchcraft in the country of Benin. He wanted to know if I could advise him regarding the claims of a local woman who insists that God had sent a spirit to her and that she was the only one who could tell this man what do for salvation.

He was obviously sincere in his question. He had asked other questions already that indicated to me that he really wanted to know more about the faith. We were meeting in a very hot and cramped room with very little air circulation and had been there for a long time; yet like everyone else, he had stayed and listened to the questions others were asking, listening to the answers, and asking questions of his own. It was late on a Saturday afternoon; yet, here he was asking his question with as much sincerity as anyone else.

I couldn't help but think of the hold that Simon once held on the people of Samaria. Act 8:9-11 **Now there was a man named Simon, who formerly was practicing magic in the city and astonishing the people of Samaria, claiming to be someone great; and they all, from smallest to greatest, were giving attention to him, saying, "This man is what is called the Great Power of God."** ¹¹ And they were giving him attention because he had for a long time astonished them with his magic arts. Yet his power to persuade with trickery was broken when Philip came preaching the truth. Acts 8:12,13 **But when they believed Philip preaching the good news about the kingdom of God and the name of Jesus Christ, they were being baptized, men and women alike.** ¹³ Even Simon himself believed; and after being baptized, he continued on with Philip, and as he observed signs and great miracles taking place, he was constantly amazed.

Here, in the city of Bohicon, was a 21st century example of that very thing happening. Who can legitimately say that the Bible is no longer relevant?

In answering the young man's question, I did not dwell on the events recorded in Acts 8. As similar as the circumstances were, the more compelling passage to direct him to is found in the letter to the churches of Galatia.

Galaiaans 1:6-12 ⁶ I am amazed that you are so quickly deserting Him who called you by the grace of Christ, for a different gospel; ⁷ which is really not another; only there are some who are disturbing you and want to distort the gospel of Christ. ⁸ But even if we, or an angel from heaven, should preach to you a gospel contrary to what we have preached to you, he is to be accursed! ⁹ As we have said before, so I say again now, if any man is preaching to you a gospel contrary to what you received, he is to be accursed! ¹⁰ For am I now seeking the favor of men, or of God? Or am I striving to please men? If I were still trying to please men, I would not be a bond-servant of Christ. ¹¹ For I would have you know, brethren, that the gospel which was preached by me is not according to man. ¹² For I neither received it from man, nor was I taught it, but I received it through a revelation of Jesus Christ.

It only took a few brief moments to explain the context of the passage and the need for Paul to have written it. The young man listened carefully, understood Paul's argument and was satisfied that he did not have to fear this woman or any power that she claimed. He was grateful for having been shown such clear and authoritative instruction from the word of God.

It is like that in Bohicon. Good people are held captive to the superstition and false teachers of spiritual darkness. God's word is still living and active and sharper than any two edged sword (Heb. 4:12).. It still leads people out of the kingdom of darkness and into the kingdom of God's beloved son (Col. 1:13). And the Lord's church is still the pillar and the support of the truth (1 Tim. 3:15)! The people of Bohicon need the truth. Bohicon needs the people of God in that city to live by faith and have a determination to give an answer to every man that asks them for the hope that is within them (1 Pt. 3:15).

And it's like that in Pearland ... keep studying!
