annual Chili Relleno Supper, which takes place in August every year after the chili peppers from Hatch, NM, come to market. The day of the event is pure madness! Hot and mild chili peppers have to be prepared in a time-consuming process, and they have to be kept in separate groups throughout the operation. Grilling at just the right temperature until the skin is blistered, but the chilies have not burned, requires constant attention. Then, they go into brown paper bags for about thirty minutes to steam, all the while keeping the mild and hot peppers separate. The chilies also have to be washed, skinned and then stuffed before the batter dip and fry skillet.

We serve all things chili for this supper—mild chili and chicken sausages, hot chili and pork sausages, chili enchilada sauce, guacamole seasoned with chilies and about a dozen large jalapeno peppers split and stuffed before being wrapped in bacon. It takes a special type of cheese, not readily available in most grocery stores, that cooks well when stuffed in peppers. The dipping batter for the peppers is made from ingredients not found in most kitchen pantries. Naturally, when it is time for grilling, almost everything needs to be grilled or fried at about the same time. It gets intense! Debbie wants her house presentable for guests, which means she wants it cleaner than the White House at a state dinner function. I want the lawns to be just as presentable. That means that the entire day of the event is filled with chores, shopping, and preparation. Before it is over, it's all hands on deck in the kitchen. Ladies are stuffing, dipping, frying, and arranging, while kids are running around the house and hot pans of food from the grill are being brought in for the next step.

It wasn't a good time to learn that the sink in the guest bath would not drain! Eventually, we discovered that the problem wasn't a blockage down line from the sink. It was a problem between the sink and the attic! The air conditioner drip lines tie into the main sewer system in the cabinet underneath the sink in the guest bath. They chose that day to form a blockage that prevented the necessary venting required for water to drain. (Just before leaving for Africa, I had gone up into the attic and flushed my lines with bleach so Debbie wouldn't have a problem while I was gone. Apparently, more maintenance was needed.) The next day I had to install extra vent pipes, valves, and the right kind of fittings to purge my lines with compressed air. Problem solved—no expensive service call to a plumber, just a lot of time sweating in the attic, and thinking and planning ahead so that this doesn't happen again. If only I had been as prepared with the plumbing as I was for the meal! In retrospect, that was the greater issue!



And so it is in life. We plan our lives with big events. We work hard for those special moments. But we seldom think about the more critical issue of having a well-ordered life before God. A little spiritual neglect seems harmless. No one really spends much time on such things these days. An hour or so at church on Sundays is plenty of time—more than enough really.

REALLY? Don't plan your life around fun times and fun people or fill the hours of your life feeding only your goals and ambitions— plan your life around God and keeping His commandments (Eccl. 12:13). 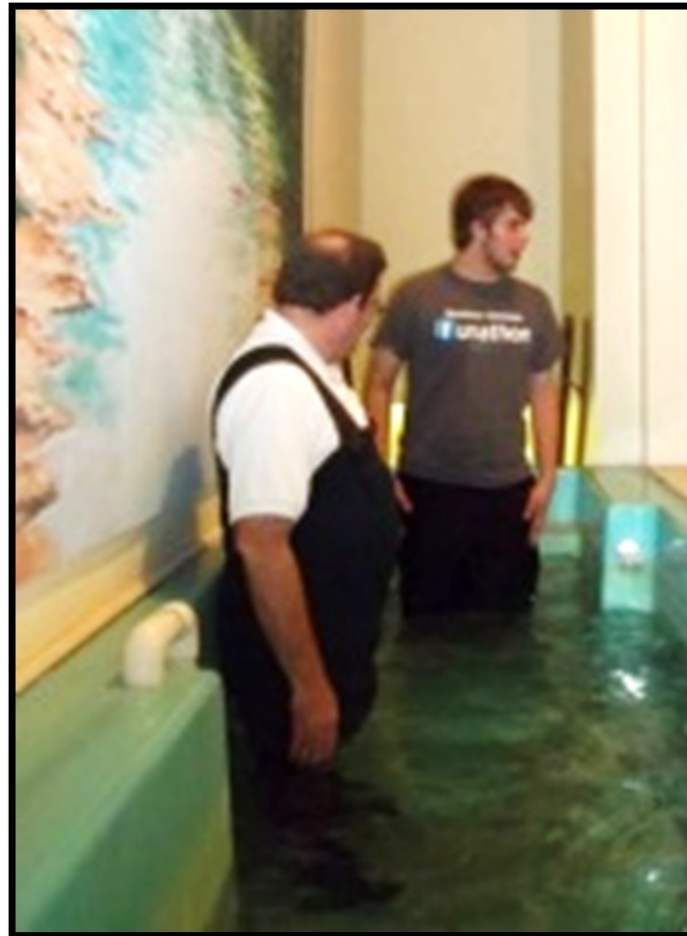
