DON'T MISPLACE YOUR PRIORITIES

By my count, we are 12 days away from the Christmas holiday. Plane tickets have been purchased, gifts have been wrapped, and families all over the world are preparing to spend some time together. This is a wonderful time of year, but it is also a time when we can start to put emphasis on unimportant things and misplace our priorities. Jesus spent considerable time in his ministry addressing people with misplaced priorities, and I feel that in this season it is an appropriate time to consider where our priorities are.

Matthew 23:13

13 "Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You shut the kingdom of heaven in men's faces. You yourselves do not enter, nor will you let those enter who are trying to.

It is a widely accepted fact that the Pharisees and the teachers of the law were considered the upper crust in Jewish society, the ruling class if you will, and they were extremely proud of this fact. They were so proud of this fact that they were willing to fight to protect their way of life, so much so that they would not even listen to John, who was sent to prepare the way for Jesus, or Jesus himself (John 1:23). Worse than the fact that they didn't want to believe in what Jesus was doing is that they were keeping others from believing in the Kingdom, as well, through their actions which showed how misplaced their priorities were.

The world we live in today is in desperate need of Jesus Christ. The world we live in is plagued with people and things that are shutting the door to the Kingdom, and unfortunately sometimes these people and things are Christians. Unchurched people look

at Christians and see us fighting among each other, living with misplaced priorities, and backstabbing, all the while proclaiming to be followers of Christ. This is not a new phenomenon, and the answer to this problem is not new either; it is found in 1 Corinthians 10:31-33.



1 Corinthians 10:31-33

31 So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God. 32 Do not cause anyone to stumble, whether Jews, Greeks or the church of God — 33 even as I try to please everybody in every way. For I am not seeking my own good but the good of many, so that they may be saved.

As God's people, we need to consider our actions and where our priorities are. If we are faced with the decision to do something that glorifies God or something that is sinful, then we need to choose the former and not the latter. When we have the opportunity to be in the company of unchurched individuals, then we need to do our best to live out a Christian example, not by putting on a fake façade, but by living the kind of life that makes God proud. We can do it; but it will take a great deal of work, and it starts with having our priorities in the right place.

As we close, I would like to leave you with a quote:

"Eight times in this chapter Jesus pronounces woe upon the scribes and Pharisees. The word is an interjection and means a term of grief or dismay, and when spoken by an inspired man, means that great calamity is in store for those referred to."-E.M. Zerr

Don't live a life that is a life of woe; rather, live a life that reflects Jesus.
