TEEN LEADERSHIP RETREAT REPORT

I'm not sure the first time I heard the words, "...you teenagers are the future of the Church" uttered, but I know that it was an often said and prayed phrase by older men admonishing the teenagers in my congregation. While the people that made this statement had the best of intentions, the statement is not a completely true one. Teenagers that are baptized believers are already in the Lord's church (Acts 2), so they are not just the future of the Church but the present as well. I believe a more appropriate statement is that teenagers of today will become the adult leaders of the Lord's Church in the future. It is this idea that inspired the Bay Area congregations to participate in a leadership retreat for 10th-12th graders.

This annual leadership retreat is the brainchild of Steve Haney, the Youth and Family Minister at the Westside Church of Christ in Alvin. Every year Steve, along with several other youth ministers, challenges the teenagers with a different aspect of leadership. This year it was decided that we would focus on leading younger children in the Lord's Church.

This past Friday we challenged the teenagers at the retreat with planning a day camp for children from our respective congregations the next day. The teens planned out the theme (Superheroes of Faith), the Bible classes, learning activities, and crafts for the children. The teens had a late night of planning and were supervised by the adult leaders at the retreat, which resulted in a wonderful day for our children.

Saturday came bright and early, but our teenagers stepped up to the challenge of leading the children. The children were treated to a day of singing songs that they like, learning about Bible characters like David and Timothy; and they even got to take turns using a "slingshot" to kill Goliath. What is most impressive is that the teenagers planned all of this in a span of about two hours and used only the materials that we brought for them to use.

As always, you can be extremely proud of the four teenagers from Pearland who participated in this event because they all did an outstanding job. I want to end this report by letting these four teenagers tell you about the retreat in their words.

Matthew Fabian says, "The most fun part of the weekend was the human obstacle course because we had a direct influence on the most enjoyable part of the day for the kids."
