Over the past weekend, I was approached about the possibility of preaching a gospel meeting. It was not a definite invitation and may never advance beyond the talking stage, but it is the second time this year I have been approached to hold a meeting. For the second time I expressed surprise and noted that brethren so seldom hold Gospel Meetings these days.

I'm in my fifth decade, and my children are just entering their third. I grew up in an era where Gospel Meetings were as normal, accepted and as anticipated as things like High School football in the fall or trees leafing out in the spring. Today's young parents know nothing of Gospel Meetings other than that they're a throwback to an age no longer relevant. Their children will likely never know what a Gospel Meeting is except as defined by Wikipedia.

My own perspective on Gospel Meetings has been overtly pessimistic, citing poor attendance and even poorer connections with the local community. I've considered the death of the Gospel Meeting to be by the hand of such culprits as television, the overreaching influence of school with its overscheduling of extracurricular activities six days out of seven, as well as other activities and events that compete for free time and that promise more pleasure and less commitment. And if those are the villains, then the handmaiden would be wealth and the promise of wealth.

While I believe there is plenty of evidence to substantiate my views, what has been surprising to me is that each individual approaching me about holding a Gospel Meeting saw its demise from another quarter. They cite the scarcity of men who will preach the truth without an agenda for changing the church. I want to deny this, but I know it is true.

## GOSPEL MEETINGS?

A congregation is led from the pulpit, and, if the congregation has no interest in evangelism or if it is interested but has no effectiveness, then at least some of the blame comes from the pulpit.

We no longer live in the era of the Gospel Meeting; instead ours is the era of the Emergent Church. Facts are harsh and uncompromising. As such, they are seen as impediments to social dialogue and the right of every man to be right. The Emergent Church isn't looking to indoctrinate men with absolute truth, it only seeks relevancy as a means of improving society. In a non-confrontational way, we seek to effect positive change without moral absolutes.

If our church family is uncomfortable with the confrontational style of the gospel, it may very well be because the pulpit has surrendered truth and bought in on the idea of cultural acceptance. One of the few "absolute truths" today holds that tolerance is always a virtue, and to achieve it some things must give way. A congregation firmly rooted in truth cannot always be tolerant. A congregation that knows how to discern good from evil cannot effectively embrace the philosophies of men.

If younger families in the church are turned off by the divisive truth of the Gospel, then it must also be true that their contemporaries outside the church are equally offended. The question to be asked is this: What influenced such thinking? Has the preacher yielded to the pressure of non-confrontational preaching in the misguided belief that such a strategy will entice more sinners to embrace Christianity? If you disagree, you may be right, but are the younger preachers preaching absolute truth? Are the growing congregations engaging in evangelizing with the Gospel message? In too many instances they are not. It may be time to revisit the Gospel Meeting!
