“What if instead of just teaching our teens about faith, we gave them a place and time to put their faith in action?” That was the question posed by the Bay Area youth ministers seven years ago which began the now annual event, Faith in Action. For those of you not familiar with this project, every year the Bay Area youth groups get together the first weekend in December and go out with the Impact Church of Christ to help care for the homeless men and women who live on the streets of Houston.

I'd like to try to paint you a picture of what happens each December as we work with the teens in this project. We meet early on a Saturday and leave for the Impact Church of Christ. If you have never been to Impact, I would ask you to picture a church building that is crossed with a soup kitchen and halfway house, because that is much of what Impact does. When we arrive, we are met by Les Rose, the minister of the Impact Church of Christ, who will lead us on our journey to where the homeless people of Houston live. We then begin to assemble the items we are going to share with the people we meet on the streets of Houston. Once we have those items assembled, we have a devotional where we sing praises to God and hear a portion of his word and pray his blessings upon our work for the day. Following that devotional, Les prepares our groups for what they will see on the streets that day and stresses the need for safety in numbers as we go out on a bus to do our work for the day.

The bus takes us to places that you typically only see in your car as you drive by on the freeway; and while this is background scenery to us, this is a home for hundreds of outdoorsmen who live in

Houston. The teens then pass out our items to the outdoorsmen (the term the homeless people of Houston prefer) and pray with them. This also gives Les an opportunity to tell them about Jesus and the good work of the Impact Church of Christ. After we have passed out everything that we have, we then return to the Impact building and Les leads us in a debrief session and a closing prayer. I probably have not done justice to the work that is done, but I hope you have a little better idea of what goes on during Faith in Action.

Something that began as a project geared specifically for teens has now grown into something that encompasses all ages in the congregations involved. Something that began as a service opportunity for our teenagers has turned into something that our teenagers now do with their families, and now you can be a part of this wonderful act of service as well.

We are challenging all of the congregations involved in this project to collect 150 throw-type blankets to hand out to the outdoorsmen. These blankets don't need to be new; but they do need to be clean, useable, and easy to carry by the outdoorsmen. If your house is like mine, you probably have a perfectly good blanket that it is not being used and could be donated for this great work. These blankets need to be brought to the youth room no later than Sunday, December 1.

This year's Faith In Action is December 7. I would encourage anyone who would like to participate to please let me know. The van will be taken, and if we fill it up we can always arrange for a carpool.
