The old hymn admonishes us, "Count your many blessings, name them one by one." This is a good reminder to all of us who are children of God. We live in a country that is more blessed than any nation in the world, and even our poorest citizens have more than millions of people throughout the world. It is interesting to me that sometimes we look at our blessings as burdens. To illustrate my point, I would like to share with you a little slice of life from the Cartwright household this week.

We have been living in our house since June 2008. We are extremely happy with our house and understand that we are very blessed to live in our house here in Pearland. Even though we love our home and consider it a blessing, there are things that we would like to be different about our house. One thing we've dreamed about changing, almost from the moment we moved into our home, is our patio. I've gone to bed exhausted the last couple of nights, but I have a comfortable bed and pillow to sleep on, while there are millions that do not have these luxuries. I've been famished every night when I sat down at my table to eat, but I have been blessed that there has been a hot meal waiting for me there.



I hope that all of you realize just how blessed we really are living in this great nation, in a welcoming community with many opportunities that many people in the world do not have. I hope that you will stop from time to time and thank God for the blessings that you have even when they come in the form of sore muscles. If you are having trouble being thankful, I would encourage you to remember these words from the apostle Paul.

Philippians 4:10-13

¹⁰I rejoiced in the Lord greatly that now at length you have revived your concern for me. You were indeed concerned for me, but you had no opportunity. ¹¹Not that I am speaking of being in need, for I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content. ¹²I know how to be brought low, and I know how to abound. In any and every circumstance, I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and need. ¹³I can do all things through him who strengthens me.

Paul knew how to count his blessings. I hope that I will do a better job of counting mine, and I expect all of you to hold me accountable.
