Strongly worded language is not unusual in Scripture, but it is often ignored. Soothing rhetoric often enjoys universal acceptance and is even embraced by atheists. Examples would include Mt. 7:12; Mt. 12:35; 1 Cor. 13:4-7.

Scripture is very clear on two pertinent points:

- 1.) God is the source of all truth, and therefore what is contained therein is both of God and necessarily true (Jn. 17:17). Denying truth because it is harsh is futile.
- 2.) God cannot be denied, and He certainly won't be ignored (Rm. 1:18-20).

Let's briefly examine that second point. Romans 1:18-20 ¹⁸For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men who suppress the truth in unrighteousness, ¹⁹because that which is known about God is evident within them; for God made it evident to them. ²⁰For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes, His eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly seen, being understood through what has been made, so that they are without excuse.

There are five concise arguments raised:

- 1.) It is not possible to suppress truth except by being unrighteous. Righteousness is the state of being right in the sight of God. To be an adult who suppresses what God has revealed about Himself and our relationship to Him is to be unrighteous. And it can be no more acceptable to God than for an adult to deny his own father's existence and a personal relationship to his father. Even if he never saw his father, he could not deny that he has one. And to make the conscious decision as an adult that he no longer has a father and never did have one is an absolute insult. To create a doctrine that denies the existence or need of a father cannot be done without destroying truth.

- 2.) For the unrighteous, it is never possible to escape

the wrath of God. The folly of the unrighteous is to say that there is no God (Psalm 14:1), as if by denying God's existence one is immune to God's wrath. To illustrate: a person might foolishly choose to be of the opinion that the courts of this land have no authority and therefore he is free to do as he wishes. But that opinion does not obliterate the courts nor does it insulate him from their judgments.



- 3.) God's wrath visited upon every generation is itself a visible thing. Men, by denying God's existence and authority, have never created a better society! A godless culture does not breed men and women with inherent honesty and a desire to seek the betterment of mankind. Did the great experiment of the U.S.S.R., which taught for 70 years that there is no God, make that country great? Did they solve the problems of alcoholism, rising divorce rates, child abandonment, cruelty, greed, anger, or lust by denying God and elevating Humanism as a god? As a culture goes further away from God, the evident consequences of its folly are undeniable! Its denial brings about a worsened human condition that is visible.

- 4.) God's wrath is justified by the fact that He has made His eternal existence and power and holiness evident to all men. Creation declares His existence, nature, power, and glory (Ps. 19:1). It is not possible for the intellectual to see what is and deny its greater Cause!

- 5.) Neither man's ignorance nor his denial of God is excusable. There has never been a generation of mankind that was without the required evidences necessary to acknowledge God and those things about His nature that make Him God.

Ahab didn't like strong words (1 Kings 22:8), but not even a king as powerful as he could "wish them away." We need to soberly think on these things and share them with others.
