Many of the lessons that I have preached from the pulpit this year have been focused on things that define true faith and the true church. More than that, they have also been intended to expose what isn't true faith and why, what isn't the true church and why.

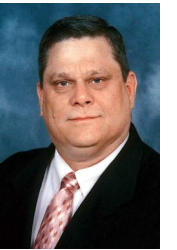
Satan has attempted, often with great success, to obscure virtually everything that is true with that which is not. Sometimes the error is obvious, and sometimes it is subtle. We might even think of it as harmless or simply a different nuance and, in so doing, forget the power of language. An example of that might be what is commonly referred to as "The Lord's Prayer" (Mt. 6:9-12). The Lord uttered it and it was a part of His Sermon on the Mount, but it was never His prayer! Yet, to call it that is to think of it as that and then to come to rely on it as though it were a talisman to be uttered in a time of personal danger.

If it must be given a name, it would be better to call it a model prayer. It contained the substance of things those disciples of Christ should petition God for in prayer. It was not a formula, and reciting it by rote was never commanded or implied. Because Jesus taught this model prayer in the Sermon on the Mount, we need to see it in that context. All that it includes supports and complements others things said within that sermon to those disciples.

Jesus came to proclaim a coming kingdom, purchase a coming kingdom, establish a coming kingdom, and reign over a coming kingdom. In preaching the Sermon on the Mount, only the first of those four things was a reality. He was proclaiming a coming kingdom, and His sermon was all about that kingdom to come. It was about how to live righteously in that kingdom and about what would be markedly different in that kingdom to what was currently taught as the acceptable standard of righteousness (Mt. 5:20). The model of praying that He taught reflects a disciple's understanding of those things. In this and future articles we'll look at some of

the things expressed in the prayer and how they relate to the overall message of the Sermon on the Mount.

Matthew 6:9-13 ⁹ "Pray, then, in this way: 'Our Father who is in heaven, Hallowed be Your name. ¹⁰ Your kingdom come. Your will be done, On earth as it is in heaven. ¹¹ Give us this day our daily bread. ¹² And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. ¹³ And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen."



"Our Father" is an expression we are familiar with, for it is a part of the gospel message. Through the blood of Jesus, God has made us His own. We are His children. Yet in the old covenant, under which these disciples still lived, God was almost never referred to as "Father." Only six times in the Old Testament does the word refer to God. Of those, two are clearly speaking of the messianic kingdom to come. To address God as "Father" would be a part of the new relationship enjoyed in the kingdom to come. That word is found 1,360 times in the Old Testament but almost always it spoke of a human-to-human relationship. Jews prayed to the God of their fathers and gloried in the fact that they were the sons of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. They knew the Almighty as Jehovah, as God of the universe, as the God of their forefathers. Jesus taught them to address God in the intimate and loving setting of a child speaking to his father.

Jesus often referred to God as His Father; and when He came to earth, He came to give the right to become children of God to those who believe in His name (Jn. 1:11).

Today, to be in the kingdom of Christ is to know Him as Savior, and God as our Father. Every epistle written by Paul begins with the statement that God is our Father. Every New Testament letters calls God our Father. To be in that kingdom that was to come, and now is, is to have the right to call God "Father." When you pray, remember that honor!
