This year's session of Camp Bandina was a great success! This year our theme entitled "Follow Me" was centered on the topic of discipleship, and each day we examined different aspects of discipleship. One of the key scriptures we drew from for our source material was Luke 14:25-33, which says...

Luke 14:25-33

25 Now great crowds accompanied him, and he turned and said to them, 26 "If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. 27 Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. 28 For which of you, desiring to build a tower, does not first sit down and count the cost, whether he has enough to complete it? 29 Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it begin to mock him, 30 saying, 'This man began to build and was not able to finish.' 31 Or what king, going out to encounter another king in war, will not sit down first and deliberate whether he is able with ten thousand to meet him who comes against him with twenty thousand? 32 And if not, while the other is yet a great way off, he sends a delegation and asks for terms of peace. 33 So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple.

The five aspects of discipleship we looked at were the definition of a disciple, the cost of discipleship, the benefits and blessings of discipleship, the equipping of the disciple, and the disciple's effect on others. These were challenging topics that caused a great deal of discussion among the adults and the teens that were at camp. One

aspect of our education program that was different this year was dividing the boys and girls by grade and gender for one afternoon session. This was exciting on many levels because our talented, godly women at camp rarely get a chance to teach the girls one-on-one, and it was a great experience for our teens to be able to share things with one another as young Christian men and young Christian women. As a teacher, I felt our education committee did an excellent job of tackling such a weighty topic.



There are so many wonderful things besides our education program at Camp Bandina. Each day the teens and adults present spend time praising God in song, singing old favorites as well as learning some new songs. Our teens are allowed to spend time playing team sports every day where the senior boys take on a leadership role as team captains. Each night (when it wasn't raining) we were blessed to worship under the trees outside and hear messages from God's word from some of the most gifted speakers in our brotherhood.

I'd like to take this opportunity to publicly thank Amy Cuellar for taking time off of work to chaperone our group and serve as counselor for the week, as well as Mitzi Williams and April Cartwright for serving as relief drivers (with a little company from Morgan Cuellar). I would also like to thank our elders for encouraging and supporting our youth ministry by allowing us to attend activities like church camp and allowing us the use of the church van to come and go from camp. Next summer if you have a teenager who just finished the 7th grade, please plan on sending them to Camp Bandina!
