The constant assault on God's word takes different forms. Three highly successful strategies that are being worked every day would include:

- Denying God's existence. This is very persuasive among the pseudo-intellectuals. The arguments usually involve "scientific data" and/or such alleged philosophical conundrums as, "How could an all-powerful and loving God allow...?"
- Polytheist and animist alike believe in spiritual forces and powers, both good and bad, that are beyond our realm and in constant control of our affairs. In many parts of the world, including within our own culture, the teaching is that if the God of Christianity or Judaism exists at all, He is only one among the many.
- A third highly effective strategy is to admit and confess the existence of an omnipotent God who would lovingly guide us but insist that He has not done so, nor is He doing so today, exclusively through His word. There are other things a believer needs to believe in and know in addition to Scripture.

That third argument is a very effective snare for millions, but Solomon once wrote, "there is nothing new under the sun" (Eccl. 1:9). The insistence that the Bible alone is not sufficient is as ancient as mankind. In fact, it was the strategy first employed by Satan to introduce sin into the world. Little wonder then, that New Testament writers such as Paul, Peter, John, and Jude wrote so much against that particular deceitful stratagem. John used the word "know" 40 times in his first epistle, usually to assure a Christian that we do know what God would have us know. As an example:

1 John 2:20,21 ²⁰ But you have an anointing from the Holy One, and you all know. ²¹ I have not written to you because you do not know the truth, but because you do know it, and because no lie is of the truth.

All obedient believers in Christ receive the gift of the Holy Spirit upon baptism (Acts 2:38,39), which is the

anointing that John writes of. Paul also said that we have all wisdom or insight since we now know the mystery of God's will through the gospel of Jesus Christ (Eph. 1:8,9) and we've been given the seal of the Holy Spirit as a pledge of our inheritance (v. 13,14). Neither John nor Paul was suggesting that all Christians have all knowledge concerning the Christian age. Otherwise, there would have been no reason for instructions and guidance that the New Testament epistles provide us with. But the knowledge of what God did to bring about our salvation, and what we must do to benefit from that grace is a requisite to being a Christian. Through the pen of Jeremiah, God had promised that very truth (Jer. 31:31-35).



How can we effectively benefit from being reminded of these things (and giving this reminder was exactly the point of what John wrote in 1 Jn. 2:20,21)?

Just as in John's day, we, too, are constantly confronted with claims that a modern-day prophet has insight and communications from God that we must know and that we cannot know on our own simply by studying the word of God. John's point was that, anything alleged by others which is contrary to what was taught in the gospel message you heard and believed, is a "lie" (v. 21). That is the same fundamental truth that Paul stressed to the Galatians a generation before when others had tried to convince them they needed to accept a different gospel (Gal. 1:8-12).

The battle for our faith depends upon our knowing the strategies of Satan and knowing Him whom we have believed and entrusted (2 Tim. 1:12). Stand firm and help those who are doubting.
