This past Saturday our congregation, along with several others in the area, participated in our annual Faith In Action campaign. In this campaign, Pearland partners with other area congregations and the Impact Church of Christ to meet the needs of the homeless people living on the streets of inner-city Houston. The thrust of our campaign this year was to meet, pray with, and distribute blankets and other items to these outdoorsmen. Generally, after a campaign of this magnitude, it is the accepted practice to give a report to the congregation; but since this campaign is an annual event and most of you are aware of what went on this past Saturday, a report of that nature would not be all that interesting to you. I have decided to use this article to share with you some of the spiritual benefits of participating in this campaign annually. I would encourage you to seek out someone who participated in the campaign this year and talk to them about their experience during Faith In Action.

#1 Cross-Generational Ministry

In our group from Pearland, the ages covered a wide spectrum: Emma was the youngest at four and our oldest participant was Chris Lindelof at ...well, you get the point, with all ages in between. It was a blessing to stand back and watch our adult members of the congregation partner with the teens and children of the congregation, working towards a common goal. To hear these older men teaching the next generation to lead a prayer with someone they have never met before was comforting and heartwarming. If we are going to prepare the next generation to take up the mantle of leadership in the church, then activities like these are essential. The Psalmist wrote, **“One generation shall commend your works to another, and shall declare your mighty acts.”** Psalm 145:4. In order for this to happen, we have to bridge the gap between the generations.

#2 Pure Religion

James wrote **“Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to visit orphans and widows in**

their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world.” James 1:27.

This past Saturday we met many people that were widowed and orphaned and ministered to them through prayer and meeting some of their physical needs. Someone once said that the great ones “practice the fundamentals,” and I believe this past Saturday that is what we were doing. Far too often, we get caught up in the minutia of our own day-to-day activities and even allow our faith to become lost in the background. Activities like Faith In Action help us to refocus and to practice that pure and undefiled religion.

#3 Sharing Burdens

Two days before we were supposed to participate in this campaign, the youth minister from Angleton had to put his young daughter into the hospital as she was suffering with pneumonia. It became evident very quickly that he would not be able to attend Faith In Action and that his teens might not be able to attend either. After a few phone calls and the servant’s heart, Chris Lindelof and I were able to share that burden with Chris Dunning and take his teens to Faith In Action. The relationship that exists between the ministers in this area is a good example of the principle that Paul tried to teach us in his letters when he wrote **“Bear one another’s burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ.”** Galatians 6:2. By the way, Chris Dunning’s little girl is home and doing much better!

I want to end this article by thanking all of you for your generous donations to this wonderful campaign. Each year we put the word out, and each year we meet and exceed our goal. That is a testament to this congregation’s loving spirit. Thank you, Chris Lindelof, and the other adults who stepped in and drove the teens and transported our donated goods to Impact for this campaign and for all that you do to support the youth ministry here. December 2015 isn’t too far away; and I am sure, Lord willing, we will participate in this campaign again next year. Please make plans to be a part of Faith In Action 2015!
