It isn't very hard to look for the situations that have no solutions. There are always problems that cannot be solved, obstacles that cannot be overcome, and goals which cannot be reached.

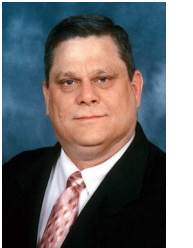
Okay, be honest with yourself now--when you read the previous paragraph, wasn't there at least a small part of you that wanted to whisper, "Nothing is impossible with God"? What Christian would argue the point?

God took a boy, whose family members sold him off as a slave and fostered a lie about his untimely death, through a dark valley that included abandoned wells, a slave block in Egypt, the pain of separation from loved ones, the vengeance of an embittered woman, the rage of a jealous husband, and the misery of a prison to develop the character of a man who would be the salvation for tens of thousands, including his own family. God took a murderer, guilty of death and forced to flee as a fugitive, and then used him to lead the Hebrews out of slavery. He used a prostitute to protect the lives of two men that Joshua sent to Jericho on an intelligence reconnaissance. The Lord opened the womb of an aged woman to bring about the birth of a child in keeping with His promise to her husband.

Now the point is not that God can intervene when we find ourselves in an impossible situation. The point is that, when God makes a promise, He provides the means to bless and empower those to whom His promise is made—for the sake of the promise itself!

The Lord has promised that the church is His bride, lovely and beautiful beyond description (Eph. 5:25-27). The Lord has promised that the church will

be a worldwide kingdom of refuge (Mt. 13:31-32). He has promised that it will never be destroyed (Mt. 16:18). The Lord has promised to be with us (2 Cor. 13:11), and He is in us (1 Jn. 4:4) as we seek to do His will. The Lord is not slack about keeping His promises (2 Pt. 3:9), and His words never fail to accomplish the purposes for which they are sent (Isa. 55:11).



We know that the Lord desires all men to be saved, coming to a knowledge of the truth (1 Tim. 2:4). We may have confidence that somehow and by some means He will make it possible for men to know the truth—but we may be just as sure that it will have to occur in a way that doesn't involve us. After all, when it comes to reaching the lost in our little corner of the world—it's somewhat of an impossible situation.

We have limited resources. We have failing infrastructure. We live in a city, part of a society that no longer seeks the Lord. Our message just won't resonate in this place like it does in other parts of the world. We can't afford huge advertising costs. We can't change the values of the people around us.

We can't! But He can, and He will through those who seek Him. "For the eyes of the Lord move to and fro throughout the earth that He may strongly support those whose heart is completely His" (2 Chron. 16:9). We may have to look past a lot of improbabilities and impossibilities. We may have to move beyond those whose lack of vision would impede us. But God will keep His promises and He will bless us when we serve to support His will.
