If this past Sunday evening proves typical of the immediate future, it was a great beginning! Moving to the Annex was a bold experiment. Change is something that we all embrace on an individual basis. We change up our routines at home. We like variety in what we eat, and we all get the occasional “wild hair” and shake things up a bit. Changing the times, the format, or the location of worship and assemblies on Sunday is an altogether different matter.

As was mentioned a week ago, Christians have always blended traditions with Scriptural injunctions without violating what has been written. We meet in a fixed, usually central, location by tradition. We use pews instead of rugs by tradition. We meet at standardized times by tradition. We begin services with a prayer instead of a hymn or the offering by tradition. All of these things are appropriate, and they serve us well in our desire to come together as a family to worship in spirit and in truth (Jn. 4:24).

The ability to separate in our minds what we are to do with what is a sound way of doing it is essential. Otherwise, we’ll soon fall into the trap of thinking that everything we do is a “Churches of Christ tradition.” That has been the oft-suggested, though incorrect, reasoning for singing without the accompaniment of a choir, or a band, or the piano. If we see the elements of worship as “our traditions,” we’ve lost the ability to see and then follow what God has commanded.

Furthermore, if our traditions become the determining factor, we’ll always struggle to meet the needs of our times. I don’t like the fact that younger generations don’t hold the same values that I hold

any more than my parents or grandparents did with regard to my generation. They didn’t like some of the hymns that my generation likes, and today I find myself in the same uncomfortable position. But changes in hymn styles are not inherently sinful. Changing the venue from the auditorium to the Annex isn’t sinful either. What we did last Sunday in the Annex would be impossible to replicate in the auditorium; yet, the experience is going to benefit our worship in the auditorium in the future.



I appreciate the boldness of the elders’ decision to make this move. Apparently quite a few others do as well. I set up the seating for slightly more than we typically have in attendance on any given Sunday night, and we filled almost every seat. We’ll plan for a larger crowd next week.

In the coming weeks, there will be a combination of instruction, singing new and old hymns, and, as was announced, regular lessons taught by the elders in a format that is less intimidating and far more intimate. In my dreams of the future, I see it as the place where our younger men first begin to deliver lessons and lead us in song or in prayer. I see a stronger bond of fellowship, and I see an opportunity to focus on topics and questions that are timely in ways that get all of us more engaged in the process. Of course, providing opportunities for obedience to the gospel, requesting prayers, and even providing opportunities for those who couldn’t share in the Lord’s Supper at the AM service are still offered.

I know that I’ll see you next Sunday morning, and I’m expectantly looking forward to seeing you Sunday night!
