How much do you make in a week?” The detective then speaks: “I make \$90.23 per week – but I sleep nights!”

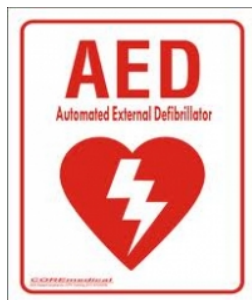
