I've been reading Leonard Gross's account of *The Last Jews in Berlin*. It chronicles the hardships and harrowing escapes from the death camps by Jews who chose not to believe Nazi propaganda about relocation camps. For them, no hour of the day or

night and no places were truly safe. No stranger or acquaintance could be readily trusted. Still, it was the kindness of strangers who daily risked their own lives to help Berlin's underground Jews.

One such benefactor who lived in Berlin was himself a citizen of Sweden. As a neutral country, Swedish officials, fearful of being overrun by Germany, would have dealt just as harshly with him, as would the Gestapo. Erik Perwe was the priest for the Berlin congregation of the Church of Sweden. He forged identity cards, gave sanctuary, and smuggled Jews out of Nazi Europe. Considering the fact that his predecessor had been deported by the Gestapo on suspicion of aiding Jews, Erik Perwe truly put his life on the line every day.

I know someone is probably reading this bit of history and growing impatient. What does any of it have to do with us? Patience, grasshopper.

I wasn't familiar with the Church of Sweden and could only assume it was a Lutheran derivation. Research confirmed that I was right about that. I also learned that though they boast 70% of Swedes are members, that's an alarmingly low percentage given it is the state church. In fact, they are losing membership at a rate of greater than 1% annually. How can that be? In 1996, automatic membership at birth for all Swedish citizens ceased. In 2000, the government stopped all financial support of the church. It is officially an evangelical Lutheran body, but it retains high church customs and has an openly homosexual woman as its archbishop. Although it claims to be the third largest church in Europe, the fact remains that its membership continues

to decline. All of the above factors contribute to that decline, but its biggest problem is that it was never designed to grow in the first place!

You see, the Church of Sweden has no path to growth. When the Swedish Parliament revised its constitution so that citizenship by birth no longer makes one a member of the Church of Sweden, there really wasn't another way to increase membership. Lutherans do not hold gospel meetings. While one can apply for citizenship and then further apply for membership in the Church of Sweden, it is a difficult thing to do. If one wants to hold office in the Church of Sweden, rules require that he or she be at least 18, be a church member, AND be baptized.

How quickly we make a mess of things when we decide we know a better way than God does! I would imagine that any archbishop of the Church of Sweden has to be constantly depressed by their church's slow demise into obscurity, made doubly so by an intentional decision that removes a path to church growth.

They can't grow because they tied growth to nationalism. But what is even sadder still is when the Lord's church decides to abandon efforts that reach out to the lost souls of its community.

To assume that responsible parents and effective preaching in its pulpit will assure the next generation of Christians is to be as far down the path of decline as any state denomination that sees the church as its own franchise into the spiritual needs of its citizens. When those citizens don't see that spiritual need and when their culture and media denounce the need, that state church is doomed. Are we really going to succeed (when others have failed) by abandoning the Lord's call to reach the lost where we are, in the hope that the economical strategy of keeping the porch light on is going to be sufficient?

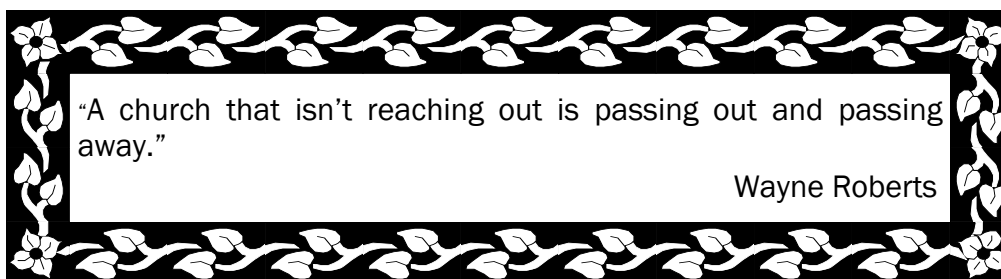
